1. INSTALLATION

The ODT Indexer component can be installed like any other component. Simply browse the installer to the zip file and click "Install".

During installation, the component will install the ODT search mambot. Once it's done, it will display the success screen:

2. MANAGING FILES

Once you've installed the component, you will find an option called ODT Indexer in your component menu.

Once you've clicked it, you will see a list of all currently indexed files.

You can give each document a name. The column "Index time" will display the date and time on which the document was last indexed (normally after each save or update action).

The column "File time" will read the documents last modified date and display that.

Based on those two columns you can decide whether it's needed to update the index.

2.1. Adding and editing files

The ODT Indexer component does not allow you to update documents itself, you'll have to use FTP or another component for that.

Click new to add a new index.

You can define the name of the file here, also you'll have to enter the path to the document, relative to the Joomla root.

Click save or apply to save the changes and create an index. Only files of the types ODT and Docx are supported at this point.

3. SEARCHING

There is no frontend search functionality. The component will install a mambot which will extend the Joomla search functionality.

If you've added some documents, simply search for one of the words in your documents and the file should appear among the results.
